A SQUARE DEAL

A contract worth more than £8 million has booked J S Wright into a major new neighbourhood development project in London.

The company will fit out 276 new apartments, including affordable homes, within the second phase of the £220million London Square mixed-use scheme at Grange Road in Bermondsey.

J S Wright will supply and install an energy centre and associated pipework to deliver low temperature hot water heating to the one to three -bedroom apartments and penthouses. It will also install a boosted cold-water plantroom and distribution network to serve all the units.

Each apartment within the five to seven-storey scheme will be equipped with underfloor heating or radiators, with hot and cold water delivered via a heat interface unit.

The company will also supply and equip all the properties with sanitary ware and mechanical extract ventilation systems.

The installation of dry risers, domestic sprinklers, an internal rainwater system, above ground drainage

and building management system controls is also part of the brief.

Scheduled for completion in March 2022, the new deal follows the success of a £7million contract completed for London Square last year for the fit out of 252 new homes at the London Square Caledonian Road mixed-use development in Islington.

Managing Director Phil Leech commented: "We are delighted to have been reappointed by such a prestigious London housebuilder to help turn a former industrial site in another district of London into a vibrant new neighbourhood."

J S Wright has boosted its contribution to the Harbour Central development in London's Docklands.

Having installed the mechanical services for the Galliard scheme's 42-storey Main Tower and the mechanical and electrical services for the amenity and club areas, the company has won a new contract to install the M&E services for an eight-storey commercial 'link' building.

The company initially installed the mechanical engineering infrastructure for the development.

STAYING VIGILANT

What a past few months it has been!

For many, the biggest concern they currently have regarding their health and safety is Covid-19. The danger posed by Covid-19 is being taken seriously by J S Wright and all our clients, and there is a plethora of measures in place to ensure the safety of our employees who have returned to work.

There is such a proliferation of information regarding the coronavirus that it can be easy to forget that we have always worked in a high-risk industry.

The Health and Safety Executive has recently released the annual figures of work-related fatalities. Tragically, 111 workers were killed, 40 of whom were construction workers, who also make up for the largest share. Fiftyone members of the public were also killed.

The three most common causes of fatal injuries continue to be falls from height (29 fatalities), being struck by a moving vehicle (20) and being struck by a moving object (18), accounting for 60% of the total figure.

Of these workers, 27% were aged 60 or over, even though this age band constitutes only around 10% of the workforce. This does not correlate with the theory that accidents happen to workers with a poor work ethic, or to young inexperienced workers making mistakes. Complacency is a very real danger; the potential for harm can become forgotten for any task done sufficiently frequently.

No one should be made ill, or get hurt or killed, at work. As many of us have had extended time off, it is imperative that we all remember we are now back to work and in the danger zone.

But the message here is not one of doom and gloom. If we all look out for each other and share experience, knowledge and ideas in the way we have done for the past few months, we can beat this virus and anything else that may stop us from getting home safe and well to loved ones.

ANOTHER WIMBLEDON WINNER

J S Wright is being kept busy at a major mixed-use regeneration scheme in Wimbledon.

Already installing the engineering infrastructure systems, the company has now secured a contract worth more than £5 million for the fit out of the middle and biggest phase of Wimbledon Grounds.

It will install the mechanical services for no less than 413 highquality private apartments within the development on the site of a former dog track in Plough Lane.

Wimbledon Grounds is being developed by Galliard Homes alongside a new stadium for football club AFC Wimbledon and will eventually comprise over 600 homes and 18,000 sq ft of commercial space.

J S Wright is already working with Galliard Homes on an energy centre, boosted cold water plantroom, plantroom ventilation and a building management system within Stadia Three, which represents the first residential element of Wimbledon Grounds.

As part of the middle phase of the scheme, the company will provide and install a low-pressure hot water heating system and pipework to deliver low-temperature hot water via heat interface units to radiators in all

the apartments across the sevenstorey buildings.

It will also supply and equip the apartments with energy efficient mechanical ventilation heat recovery systems. Fire prevention sprinklers, sanitary ware and HPDE above ground drainage will also be fitted. Completion of the new contract is scheduled for September 2021.

Managing Director Phil Leech commented: "We are delighted that after being brought in from the start by supplying and installing the shell and core services we have now also been commissioned to complete the apartment fit out on the middle and biggest phase of this major project.

"This contract is a tribute to the proven skills and expertise of our highly trained workforce which has made us the preferred choice of M&E services contractor for leading residential developers."

THE POWER BEHIND NINE ELMS POINT

A key part of the ongoing transformation of London's South Bank has been completed with the help of J S Wright.

Nine Elms Point at Vauxhall is a new landmark residential and retail development from Barratt London within the Nine Elms regeneration area, which extends from Vauxhall to Battersea.

J S Wright installed the mechanical services for 645 private and shared ownership apartments and penthouses within its seven metallic buildings, including one of 37 storeys, and a new flagship Sainsbury's superstore.

The residential element of Nine Elms Point also includes a concierge, gym, lounge and dining rooms, business suite, cinema room and basement car park.

Completing a £20million contract – at the time the biggest in the company's history – J S Wright as lead coordinator provided the underfloor heating and ventilation services for all the apartments, including comfort cooling by fan coil units for selected properties.

The company also provided the hot and cold-water services including boosted cold-water distribution, sanitary ware, refuse chutes and domestic sprinklers for all the apartments.

J S Wright also installed the wet risers, a commercial sprinkler system for the Sainsbury's service yard and car park, and sprinklers for the large residential car park.

The company also fitted all the HVAC services within the commercial and gym areas and below ground drainage across the Sainsbury's podium level.

Nine Elms Point, located next to the future Nine Elms underground station and linked to the Nine Elms redevelopment by open space and landscaped raised gardens, has brought to more than 1,700 the number of apartments that J S Wright has equipped for Barratt London.
